Applications are invited for the post of a Lecturer in the Department of Mathematics. King's College London has had a very distinguished mathematical and scientific tradition since its foundation in 1829. In Pure Mathematics there are distinguished groups working in analysis and number theory, and the Department has committed itself to expand its activities in geometry. The post holder is expected to have research expertise in some area of geometry.

Candidates should have the potential to carry out research which has high levels of originality, innovation and depth that may well lead to significant impact on their field over the long term. The successful candidate will be expected to:

- Contribute to the research activity of the department, maintaining a track record of research of international excellence.
- Take part in teaching and examining for the department's undergraduate and postgraduate teaching programmes, and to supervise research students in the department.
- Make a contribution to the academic organisation of the department.

The appointment will be made, dependent on relevant qualifications and experience, within the Grade 6 or Grade 7 scale, currently £32,917 to £47,253 per annum including London Allowance. Benefits include an annual season ticket loan scheme and a final salary superannuation scheme.
